Founded in 1824, **KENTS HILL SCHOOL** is one of the oldest independent, co-educational schools in the United States. Committed to being an anti-racist academic community, our new **Diversity, Equity, and Belonging initiative** dedicates time and resources to educating students and faculty through readings and workshops during orientation and frequent talks and activities throughout the school year.

Kents Hill recently **initiated a process of curriculum redesign** aimed at readying students for the challenges of the twenty-first century, rebalancing many traditional classes to emphasize skills, character, and reflection and adding a variety of new courses exploring twenty-first-century topics. Over the past year, several events, most notably the COVID-19 pandemic, have continued to shift the way we think about our program. Suddenly, it no longer feels useful to define the Kents Hill experience as mere preparation for the future; the present demands our attention too, challenging us to not only consider the world we will inherit, but to understand the one we inhabit.

Building on our **mission** to educate students in mind, body, and character in order to prepare them for the challenges and opportunities of higher education; to learn to accept themselves and others; to work together for the common good; to be stewards of our natural environment; and to embody our long-held belief that one person of principle can always make a difference, the new **PEAK Program** (Principles, Ethics, and Action at Kents Hill) will use this year's election as part of its effort to build greater self-knowledge, teach ethical frameworks, and practice using these frameworks to wrestle with both personal and institutional problems.

COVID-19 Remote and Hybrid Learning: In the spring of 2020, Kents Hill moved to a remote learning program offering both synchronous and asynchronous opportunities for students who were spread around the globe as a result of COVID-19. This year, Kents Hill offers a new hybrid learning pedagogy serving on-campus students, those unable to enter the country, and/or whose families have chosen to keep them home. Each classroom is outfitted with video capability to allow remote learners to participate in the full class experience, seeing and hearing their teachers and classmates and able to make their own contributions to class discussions. To accommodate the deep cleaning necessary to keep the community safe and to offer better opportunities for class discussion and debate, all Wednesday classes are held online.

Campus Environment and Opportunities: Situated on a 400- acre hilltop campus that commands outstanding views of the Western Maine and White Mountains, the spirit of Kents Hill is clear. Boarding and day students form close connections within the community where the majority of the faculty live on campus with their families. Kents Hill offers a diploma program for grades 9-12 and an Academic Gap Year (AGY) certificate for post-graduates. The scenic campus has a ski slope, lake frontage, indoor skating rink, and beautiful dining commons. Kents Hill's location just 15 minutes outside Maine's capital city of Augusta affords each student special opportunities to explore and learn safely both on and off campus.

Academic Offerings: New courses allow students to engage with today's world in all of its complexity. Biochemistry of Nutrition and Global Public Health introduces students to major health-related problems in the U.S. and around the world, Environmental Economics explores the benefits and considerable costs of natural resource exploitation, the United Nations class studies the institution's origins, structure, and legislative processes. A new art course, Art and Entrepreneurship, looks at the contemporary marketplace for creative work, affording students the opportunity to start, manage, and develop their own arts-oriented businesses.

Challenging academics and extracurricular offerings include Advanced Placement, Accelerated, and Dual-Enrollment college classes, Academic Coaching through the Akin Learning Center, competitive interscholastic and intramural athletics, and fine arts. Students participate in a team sport or afternoon activity five days a week. Options include varsity sports, Outing Club, theater, community engagement, and internships.

THE ACADEMIC GAP YEAR provides high school graduates with opportunities to broaden their horizons, nurture their personal growth, and evaluate their personal and professional goals before college. All AGY students take at least 3 classes while also pursuing extracurricular and internship opportunities and completing a culminating capstone project. AGY students earn a Certificate of Attendance at the successful completion of their year at Kents Hill School.

TRANSCRIPTS only include work completed at Kents Hill School (grades 9-AGY). While academic work completed at other schools is used to meet Kents Hill diploma requirements, it is not factored into the cumulative weighted GPA which is calculated at the end of each semester. Standardized testing is under the student's control and not included on the school transcript. Kents Hill does not rank its students.

HONORS AND AWARDS Early Cum Laude recognition is bestowed upon a few returning seniors in October, and an additional cohort (with a minimum of two years at the school) is inducted at year's end. National Honor Society members are juniors and seniors. Kents Hill awards class and department prizes each year. These are not noted on the transcript but students are encouraged to include them on their college applications.

GRADING SYSTEM Grades are expressed on the transcript as letters with the following numerical and GPA equivalents.

DISCIPLINE Disciplinary incidents resulting in suspension or probation which occur in the junior, senior, and AGY are reported by the school as requested by individual colleges and universities. Disciplinary incidents occurring in the first and sophomore years (or first semester for a new junior), which have no impact on the greater school community, are considered learning experiences and are not reported. Colleges may assume that any student enrolled at Kents Hill is considered a good community member and worthy of their consideration for admission.
